6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Curriculum Development is developed by Shivaji University, Kolhapur. The University has resolved to adopt CBCS from the academic year 2016-17. Principal and two faculty members from our College are empanelled to work as experts.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

In order to make effective teaching and learning process, various methods like PowerPoint presentation and simulation exercises are undertaken are regular features of the teaching and learning process. Simulation exercise in the form of moot problem, case methods and place visits are often undertaken.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Semester end examination are carried under the observation of Shivaji University, Kolhapur. In the syllabus system of 80:20 pattern, internal assessment of 20marks is conducted by concerned subject teacher. For 100 marks pattern case comment and simulation exercises are undertaken by students.

6.3.4 Research and Development

Teacher are rigorously involved in academic research. Apart from their doctoral research, contribution in the form of seminars, research articles and participation in competition is the distinct feature of this college. Since the entire legal education is based on the legal research, students are apprised of the legal research from the first semester itself. Students are given problem to research on where they come up with legal solutions to those problems.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

Online AIR journal has been subscribed which is updated periodically. Specified amount earmarked for library is spent every year. Periodical subscription both online and of-line are hosted by the library. Sufficient numbers of computers with internet are made available to the students and staff.

All faculty members are involved in different activities like seminar, paper presentation and book writings and article publication. Five teaching staff are enrolled for doctoral degrees.

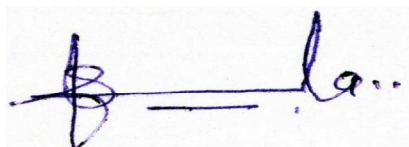
