One day Environmental Study Tour was arranged on 25th February 2020 At. Late Uttamrao Patil Bio-Diversity Park, And Babasaheb Ambedkar Nursery, Kagal which was situated at Pune-Bangalore Highway. The CO-ordinator for the tour was Dr. M.C. Sheikh Sir, and Dr. S.R. Rasam Madam. The Forest Officers Mr. Waghwade Sir, Mr. Devardekar Sir and Mr. Dipak Khade Sir, vice-Director - Social Afforestation Department, Kolhapur were also present for interaction session.

Mr. Waghwade Sir told us wide information of Bio-diversity Park and Babasaheb Ambedkar Nursery. He interact with students. He told that only forest plant species are available in Nursery. The state government provides funds time to time for preservation and protection of forest species. Bio-diversity Park situated in 58 hectares of land and Nursery in 9 hectares. In Previous Year 102 species of plants were in Nursery. Each plant has medicinal value. There are well, Borewell for water resource, irrigation. Nearly, 1,75,000 plants were sold in Year 2019. There are 11 labourers working in Bio-Diversity Park and Nursery. One of the labour named Tanaji gave the information and Demo of 'Mohagani' Plant. He worked in Nursery since-1981. Kolhapur Municipal Corporation invited students of various colleges, faculty member of political science, press representative and politicians to have open discussion on topics allotted to five different colleges.

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1. Shahaji Law College

Subject: - Strategies for combating misuse of money and muscle power during elections.

Firstly we discussed the problems related to misuse of money and muscle power during elections. The reasons for cause of this problems are:-

1- No strict implementation of laws-

It is one of the main reasons that leads to misuse of money and muscle power during election. If any political leader commits any offence such as bribery, political party is not blame for it only the leader held responsible. Though he has committed the offence, he is not actually punished for it he is released with just a warning. There are laws relating to bribery but actual scenario is that they are not actually implemented as they are supposed to be.

2- Bribery-

It is the crime of giving someone money or something else of value, often illegally, to persuade that person to do something you want. During elections through bribery vote of voter is bought. Bribery is not only in the form of money but also in the form of any pleasure such as luxurious meals, liquor, drugs etc. It is a very serious offence defined in:-

Indian Penal Code section -171B

Whoever -

1. gives a gratification to any person with the object of inducing him or any other person to exercise any electoral right or of rewarding any person for having exercised any such right; or
2. accepts either for himself or for any other person any gratification as a reward for exercising any such right or for inducing or attempting to induce any other person to exercise any such right, commits the offence of bribery;



Provided that a declaration of public policy or a promise of public action shall not be an offence under this section.

3. A person who offers, or agrees to give, or offers or attempts to procure, a gratification shall be deemed to give a gratification.

4. A person who obtains or agrees to accept or attempts to obtain a gratification shall be deemed to accept a gratification, and a person who accepts a gratification as a motive for doing what he does not intend to do, or as a reward for doing what he has not done, shall be deemed to have accepted the gratification as a reward.

3. Undue influence at elections:-

Indian Penal Code 171C :-

1. Whoever voluntarily interferes or attempts to interfere with the free exercise of any electoral right commits the offence of undue influence at an election.

2. Without prejudice to the generality of the provisions of sub-section (1), whoever

(A) Threatens any candidate or voter, or any person in whom a candidate or voter is interested, with injury of any kind,

OR

(B) induces or attempts to induce a candidate or voter to believe that he or any person in whom he is interested will become or will be rendered an object of Divine displeasure or of spiritual censure, shall be deemed to interfere with the free exercise of the electoral right of such candidate or voter, within the meaning of sub-section (1).

3. A declaration of public policy or a promise of public action, or the mere exercise or a legal right without intent to interfere with an electoral right, shall not be deemed to be interference within the meaning of this section.

4. Personation at elections :-

This offence is usually committed with misuse of muscle power by threatening. The above offence is defined in IPC

Indian Penal Code: - 171D

Whoever at an election applies for a voting paper on votes in the name of any other person, whether living or dead, or in a fictitious name, or who having voted once at such election applies at the same election for a voting paper in his own name, and whoever abets, procures or attempts to procure the voting by any person in any such way, commits the offence of personation at an election.



5. Illegal payments in connection with election:-

For Lok Sabha elections the amount of money accorded to spend on election procedure is up to 70 lakhs and for Vidhan Sabha money accorded for election procedure is up to 25 lakhs. But practically more money is spent. There is no record from where this money comes and where it is spent. Also, candidate has to submit his assessment to the election commission. But, candidate submits the false data and hence, there should be strict and rigid inspection of one's assessment of income and property.

Indian penal code: - 171-H

Whoever without the general or special authority in writing of a candidate incurs or authorizes expenses on account of the holding of any public meeting, or upon any advertisement, circular or publication, or in any other way whatsoever for the purpose of promoting or procuring the election of such candidate, shall be punished with fine which may extend to five hundred rupees;

Provided that if any person having incurred any such expenses not exceeding the amount of ten rupees without authority obtains within ten days from the date on which such expenses were incurred the approval in writing of the candidate, he shall be deemed to have incurred such expenses with the authority of the candidate.

In Indian Penal Code, the laws are well defined and strict in itself. But the major problem occurs when it comes to its implementation. Hence, the root cause in misuse of money and muscle power is no strict implementation laws and lack of awareness among the citizens.

All the above problems are discussed and then we discussed the recommendations.

The recommendations we discussed as follows –

Elections form the bedrock of the largest democracy in the world - India. Since Independence, as many as 15 Lok Sabhas have been formed through elections, the first one being held in 1951-52. The methodology of election is through universal adult suffrage, whereby every citizen of India over 18 years of age is an eligible voter in the eyes of the Constitution. Elections provide a way to the people to assert their voice, opinion and choose the person whose priorities and ideas matches with them most. In India the elections are not new and they started taking place before the independence from British rule itself. But before independence the franchise was quit limited and very few were having rights to participate and vote. After independence, India adopted universal adult suffrage and each adult Indian got the right to vote.

The importance of elections in India—and for that matter, in any democracy—is as follows:

Choice of leadership: Elections provide a way for the citizens of India to choose their leaders. They do so by casting their vote in favour of the candidate or party whose views appeal to them. This ensures that the will of the people is reflected in the elected candidates.

Change of leadership: Elections in India are also a platform for the public to voice their resentment against a ruling party. By voting for other parties and helping elect a different government, citizens



demonstrate that they possess ultimate authority.

Political participation: Elections open the door for new issues to be raised in public. If a citizen of India wishes to introduce reforms that are not the agenda of any of the parties, he or she is free to contest the elections either independently or by forming a new political party.

Self-corrective system: Because elections are a regular exercise, occurring every five years in India, the ruling parties are kept in check and made to consider the demands of the public. This works as a self-corrective system whereby political parties review their performance and try to appease the voters.

Recommendations by our group-

1 Rigid and strict implementation of Laws

Indian Penal Code (I.P.C), 1860, has managed to define well, the offences committed during the time of elections. If any person creates the offence, he or she is punishable under such penal sections.

Section 171E:- Punishment for bribery

Whoever commits the offence of bribery shall be punished with imprisonment of either description for a term which may extend to one year, or with fine, or with both; Provided that bribery by treating shall be punished with fine only.

Explanations

"Treating" means that form of bribery where the gratification consists in food, drink, entertainment, or provision.

Section 171F:- Punishment for undue influence or personation at an election

Whoever commits the offence of undue influence or personation at an election shall be punished with imprisonment of either description for a term which may extend to one year or with fine, or with both.

2 Citizen's participation:-

Success of democracy is impossible without participation of the people

Below is a list of various initiatives taken by government for effective citizen participation and providing good governance.

1. Citizen charters for all public institutions.
2. Use of ICT for effective citizen-administration interface and thus reducing corruption.
3. Policies like Consumer protection Act and Consumer forums for safeguarding consumer interests.
4. Social media presence and promotion of policies for easy and quick dissemination of information. All ministries, PMO etc. have their own accounts.



5. Involvement of various activists and members from NGOs in policy making like National Advisory Council.
6. Interaction with people through programmes like 'Mann Ki Baat'.
7. Whistle Blowers act gave power to people for reducing corruption.
8. Inaction of laws Lokpal and Lokayukta.

3. Constitutional Knowledge:-

Indian constitutional knowledge must be included in Indian educational system that is since primary educational level. Moulding the young minds right from the primitive stage. They should be well versed with their rights as well as their duties towards the state. Our constitution guarantees fundamental rights mentioned in part three and duties of part four respectively.

In representative democracy elections are the only method through which people's representative may be elected to the legislature and provide to the country the political executive or the councils of ministers to rule the country duly supported by the rein checks of the opposition. The election process therefore assumes vital importance in progress of the country. The responsibility to ensure purity and impartiality of the electoral process is not only of the government, the Election Commission and the political parties but also of every individual and institutions and the media as the four pillar of the edifice, shoulders not just the responsibility but the duty to keep the electoral process independent of any influencing factor

"Silver key opens every door" these sayings are based on practical wisdom experienced over ages. Human weakness for riches and wealth more often had not yields against moral and ethical values and temptation for unaccounted and unexpected wealth gets better hand. Softening ones morale and inducing him to depart from discharging onerous duties and responsibilities on being bribed by money power always creates problems in administrations. But when it interferes with the election process for electing a popular government on the bases of uninterred and free and fair election by the electorate, it becomes a matter of serious concern.

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2. New college

Subject: - Participation of citizens in elections

The group consisted of 5 students from New College, 1 faculty member of political science. They discussed the issue with: - Shri. Sharnagdhar Deshmukh (National Congress member)

Shri. Satish Sareekar (representative of Pudhari)

Shri. Bhupal Shete (senior councilor)

They discussed problems and recommendations on participation of citizens in election:-

The success of democracy largely depends on the participation of the voters in the election process. There is no law that would compel the voter to exercise his right. A significantly large number of voters just do not turn up to cast their votes. Fifty to sixty percent polling is considered good enough.

Problems:-

In India people do not take election seriously as their fundamental right. There is lack of participation in election process of citizens. Only 60 to 65 percent people exercise their right to vote. This 60 to 65 percent is considered good enough. Here the reason for not participating is lack of awareness about election and their voting rights.

The Election Day is just considered as another holiday. People only claim their rights but are not responsible for their duties.

Poverty – poor people are mostly focused on survival activities; their basic needs often need to be met first before they can participate, so they may have limited time or interest.

Education – without information and knowledge, meaningful participation in politics can be difficult.

Social isolation – there is a limited network to support and encourage political participation.

Personal factors – people may have limited confidence or motivation to participate.

Stigma and discrimination – majority groups may have prejudices, fears and discomfort towards people with disabilities and therefore may not support their participation.

Lack of disability-friendly processes – access barriers can make it difficult for people with disabilities to participate, e.g. inaccessible voting booths.

Lack of role models – there are few examples of people with disabilities in high profile political positions.

Legal barriers – people with disabilities are not permitted to vote, e.g. people with mental health problems.

Recommendations:-

1. PROVIDE AN EASY-TO-USE PLATFORM FOR INNOVATION AND ENGAGEMENT

When it comes to interacting with government, citizens should be empowered and engagement should be easy. They should be able to quickly retrieve data, submit forms and find the information they need.

2. EMPOWER CITIZENS

Give some authority and power in the decision-making process to citizens closest to the issues -- think neighborhood groups, councils and/or community activists -- as they can provide insights on funding allocations and cultural issues, and help develop community partnerships.



3. Vivekanand College

Subject: - Use of social media, fake news during elections.

New political media are forms of communication that facilitate production, dissemination, and exchange of political content on platforms and within networks that accommodate interaction and collaboration. They have evolved rapidly over the past three decades. New media have wide ranging implications for democratic governance and political practices. They have transformed the political media system, and redefined the role of journalists

The rise of new media has complicated the political media system. Legacy of media consisting of established mass media institutions that predate the Internet, such as newspapers, radio shows, and television news programs, coexist with new media that are the outgrowth of technological innovations.

The unlimited freedom made social media platforms are susceptible to misuse, misinformation, and thus, fake news. In the last few years, social media has turned out to be a massive player in shaping public discourse in a democratic space (Marda & Milan, 2018). Though there have been pressures from policymakers on service/platform providers, nothing concrete has built up towards accountability of the user or platform proprietors. In India, there has been a consistent increase of social media users and instances of the misuse of this medium.

A few years ago, 'fake news' was a rarely used term. Today, it has become one of the greatest threats to the existing system of democracy and a hot topic for the debaters. 'Untrue and unverified news.' 'Untrue' refers to false facts, whereas 'unverified' refers to where the facts might be true, but the numbers and characters are false.

Though there is no one definition for fake news, what makes it a concern is that it allows subjective interpretations of the concept, thus making it difficult to study or allow any policy interventions. Fake news comprises of stories, news, and hoaxes created to misinform deliberately or deceive readers or to push a political agenda. In contemporary times, various media propagate fake news. A newspaper in print media, television in broadcast and internet in digital form propagate fake news. However, due to the changing role of social media in the past few years, it has become a forerunner in the distribution of fake news. Since social media has increasingly gained acceptance among audiences, it plays a huge role in forming public opinions during elections.

Provisions of Information Technology Act, 2000

Section 69 (1) of the Information Technology Act, 2000 relate to how the Controller can extend decryption of information facilities to any agency for intercepting any information transmitted through any computer resource. The person-in-charge of the computer resource shall, when called upon by any agency directed under Section 69 (1), extend all facilities and technical assistance to decrypt the information. Any person who fails to assist the agency referred to in Section 69 (2) shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to seven years.



Section 79 of the Act, provides for cases when the Network service providers or intermediaries are not held liable. This provision of law is precisely for the removal of doubts and thus declares that no person providing any service as a network service provider/intermediary shall be liable under this Act, rules or regulations made thereunder for any third party information or data made available by him. This provision comes into play is if he proves that the offense or contravention was committed without his knowledge or that he had exercised all due diligence to prevent the commission of such offense or contravention. Also, new proposed changes under Section 79 require the online platforms to deploy technology-based automated tools or appropriate mechanisms to proactively identify or remove or disable access to illegal information or content.

Protection of Right to Freedom of Speech and Expression

In India, Article 19 (1) (a) of the constitution provides for the protection of the human right to freedom of speech and expression. Hence, any attempt to suppress the voice of people in a public sphere behind the garb of an Anti-Fake News Bill will lead to a situation of a constitutional violation. One has to have a better understanding of the role of government in curbing the propagation of fake news to make sure that even the softest of voices are heard. Also, improperly implemented laws cause redundancy of existing provisions. Article 19 (2) of Indian Constitution, already provides that nothing shall affect the operation of any existing law, or prevent the State from making any law, in so far as such law imposes reasonable restrictions on the exercise of the right conferred by Article 19 (1). Such restriction shall be in the interests of the sovereignty and integrity of India, the security of the State, friendly relations with foreign States, public order, decency or morality, or about contempt of court, defamation or incitement to an offense.

Awareness—an Alternative

One of the most significant factors leading to a broader consumption of fake news among users is their limited ability to differentiate facts from opinions. Lack of aptitude of the audience to verify the news shared on social media before consuming is leading them to consume potentially false information. To enable them to do so would require a concrete measure in terms of enhancing their media literacy.

In India, awareness campaigns have been released by service providers to alert users about the consequences of fake news and why it is important to be self-aware before forwarding any message. In December 2018, WhatsApp rolled out three ad films as a part of their strategy to fight back circulation of fake news ahead of general elections these campaigns asked the users to check the integrity of the information they receive on forward messages, before sharing it to others.

Purpose of any news is to make people aware of what is happening around and allow people to have a common ground to converse to constitute a dynamic public sphere. Social media, with its reach, popularity, and instantaneity, is a potent tool for communication development if used. Otherwise, it could also become a double-edged sword. Fake News has become a menace which could only be curbed when collective efforts are made from individual to policy level.

Political participation of women in any country gives an overview of how women are treated in society. The development of any country also depends on the equal participation of men and women. Since women's presence is seemed to be low in Indian politics, it is the duty of every human being to make them aware of their rights and motivate them for participating in mainstream politics. The constitution of India not only guarantees equality in society but also suggests states to make special provisions for women. Women still are fighting for equal status in society. Because of their low representation in Indian politics, their issues and problems are generally unseen and unnoticed. Their genuine demands are not raised before the decisions makers. Women need be dependent to make their own decisions. The media plays a significant role in determining how women in politics and decision-making bodies are viewed and perceived by society in general. It does not only play an important role in shaping the values of society but also reflects those values. It plays the role of an informer, educator and a mediator for social change. To have strong democratic governance, women's equal participation is must and therefore their contribution to this processes needs to be analyzed in the appropriate context by the media. There cannot be a real democracy if the voices and issues of women that constitute half the population of the country are ignored or sidelined. This paper analyzes the role of media about women's participation in national politics and also analyzes whether or not women's voices and issues are articulated to the public as matters of importance.

Major issues related to participation of women in election are as follows:

1. Lack of awareness:-As we live in patriarchal society women are not given much importance in elections. Till now, women in some rural areas do not even have their voter ID and other such governmental documents. Their participation at the very primary level i.e. (gram panchayat) as voters in very low.
2. Illiteracy:-Illiteracy is the main factor for lack of participation of women in election. They are not even aware about their right to vote. They do not have their own opinion of making choice, they vote on bases of others opinion. Because of their low level of education they are still living in their orthodox mind set in which women don't even step out of their house.
3. Gender inequality:- The earliest stage, the voting gender gap typically refers to the difference in the percentage of men and women voting for a particular candidate. It is calculated by subtracting the percentage of women supporting a candidate from the percentage of men supporting a candidate (e.g., if 55 percent of men support a candidate and 44 percent of women support the same candidate, there is an 11 point gender gap).

Some of the solutions to overcome the issue:-

Illiteracy does not only make it difficult for people to cast their vote on election day, it makes it harder for them to engage with the subject, understand the processes behind it, and trust in the integrity of the political system. When citizens are not familiar with the electoral process, and not able to familiarize themselves with it, levels of participation will remain low; additionally, a large number of improperly cast ballots or a dearth of confidence in the integrity of the elections or in the legitimacy of the results will follow. Such cynicism toward elections is especially likely to develop when election officials or political competitors have not fulfilled past promises.

When looking to overcome the negative effect of illiteracy on the political participation of young women, two approaches present themselves. Firstly, voter education programs can assist illiterate men and women in becoming politically active. Secondly, and more fundamentally in this case, providing young women with proper access to education will substantially reduce, if not eradicate, the issue of an



illiterate female electorate that remains (partially) disenfranchised due to a lack of basic skills. Ideally, countries facing these issues should employ a combination of both strategies in order to maximise the level of young women's political participation, both for the current generation and for those to come.

Voter Education

Voter education is defined as follows:

"It is the process by which citizens are educated on how to register and vote, develop a sense of civic duty to participate in the electoral process, and learn to respect the outcome of legitimate elections". Without a solid basis on voting principles, the conduct of voting operations can, at best, be ineffective or at worst become manipulated by partisan political or corrupt forces, leading to the undermining of public confidence in voting processes. The increasing numbers of organizations working to strengthen democracy helps non educated people and young women in particular to learn about their civic rights. Barbara Hutton underlines the importance to train non educated people on the way to use a ballot. The process is about using all material needed to vote: poster ballot, envelopes, pencils, voting bout etc. It is important to indicate, while carrying out this training, that it is not a campaign telling people who to vote for. It's one and only purpose is to show examples to non educated voters. "Most non educated people do not know that there are organizations that teach adults to read and write".

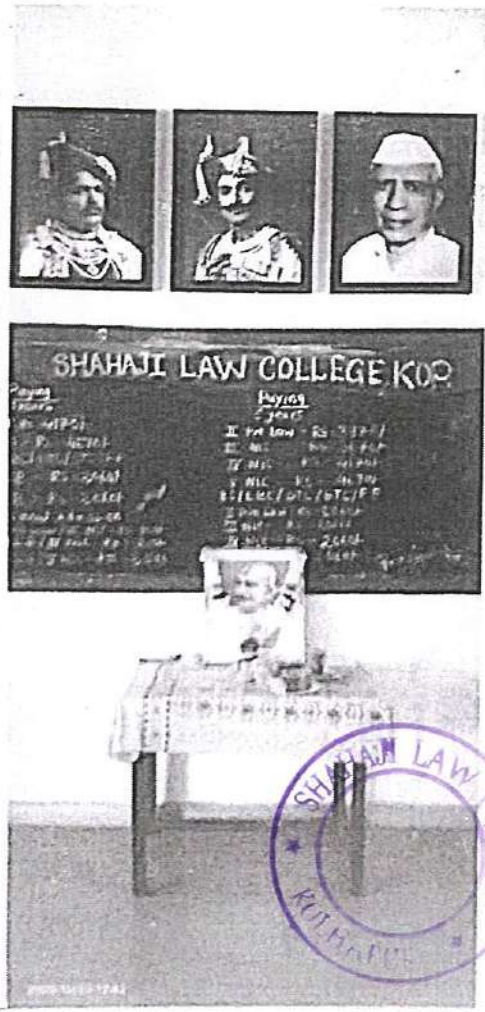

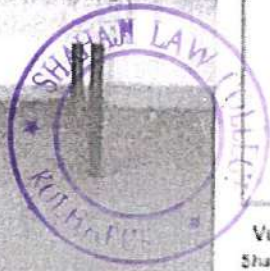


