Labour Laws emerged when Employers tried to restrict the powers of Worker's Organisations & keep labour costs low. - 2. The Chairman and other members of the Board shall be State appointed persons of appointment to the fields of labour welfare, management, finance, law and administration.
- 3. The number of persons to be nominated as members from each of the categories specified in clause (2) of sub-section (1) of the section of office and other conditions of service of members, the procedure to be followed in the discharge of their functions by, and the manner of filling vacancies among the members of the National Board shall be such as may be provided. Provided that adequate representation shall be given to persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes, the Minorities and Women.
- 4. The term of the National Board shall be three years.
- 5. The National Board shall meet at least three a year, at such time and place and shall observe such rules of procedure relating to the transaction of business as to be provided, by or by amendment.
- 6. The members may receive such allowances as may be provided by extending the provisions of the National Board.

3. The National Board shall perform the following functions, namely:

1. recommend to the Central Government suitable schemes for different sections of unorganised workers;
2. advise the Central Government on such matters arising out of the administration of this Act as may be referred to it;
3. monitor such social-welfare schemes for unorganised workers as are administered by the Central Government;
4. examine the progress of registration and issue of identity cards to the unorganised workers;
5. review the results helping functions performed at the State level;
6. review the expenditure from the funds under various schemes; and
7. undertake such other functions as are assigned to it by the Central Government from time to time.

6. State Social Security Board

1. Every State Government shall, by notification, constitute a State Board to be known as the State Social Security Board to exercise the powers conferred on, and to perform the functions assigned to it, within the State.
2. The State Board shall consist of the following members, namely:—
 - a. Minister of Labour and Employment of the concerned State Government, or officer;
 - b. One Professor/Secretary of Secretary (Labour) Ministry/Secretary to

- 3. The Chairperson and other members of the Board shall be from amongst persons of eminence in the fields of labour welfare, management, finance, law and administration.
- 4. The number of persons to be nominated as members from each of the categories specified in clause (c) of sub-section (2), the term of office and other conditions of service of members, the procedure to be followed in the discharge of their functions by, and the manner of filling vacancies among the members of, the National Board shall be such as may be prescribed: Provided that adequate representation shall be given to persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes, the Minorities and Women.
- 5. The term of the National Board shall be three years.
- 6. The National Board shall meet at least thrice a year, at such time and place and shall observe such rules of procedure relating to the transaction of business at its meetings, as may be prescribed.
- 7. The members may receive such allowances as may be prescribed for attending the meetings of the National Board.

- 8. The National Board shall perform the following functions, namely:-
- a. recommend to the Central Government suitable schemes for different sections of unorganised workers;
- b. advise the Central Government on such matters arising out of the administration of this Act as may be referred to it;
- c. monitor such social welfare schemes for unorganised workers as are administered by the Central Government;
- d. review the progress of registration and issue of identity cards to the unorganised workers;
- e. review the record keeping functions performed at the State level;
- f. review the expenditure from the funds under various Acts and
- g. undertake such other functions as are assigned to it by the Central Government from time to time.

6. State Social Security Board

- 1. Every State Government shall, by notification, constitute a State Board to be known as (name of the State) State Social Security Board to exercise the powers conferred on, and to perform the functions assigned to it, under this Act.

The number of persons to be appointed as members from each of the categories specified in clause (2) of sub-section (2), the term of office and other conditions of service of members, the procedure to be followed in the discharge of their functions by and the revision of filing vacancies, among the members of the State Board shall be such as may be provided: Provided that adequate representation shall be given to persons belonging to the Scheduled Caste, the Scheduled Tribes, the Minorities and Women.
- 5. The term of the State Board shall be three years.
- 6. The Board shall be reconstituted after the expiry of the term.

What is utmost good faith? Under law terms, Utmost Good Faith means, every individual who enters into a contract has a legal responsibility to be honest and accurate in facts provided to counterpart companies. Individuals have to disclose all the relevant facts and not to mislead.

This can be an essential principle and fundamental principle of insurance contract. It is the basis of contract. An insurance policyholder has a legal responsibility to disclose all the relevant facts to the insurer.
